THE CUSTOMER

The West Des Moines Community Schools district in Iowa has approximately 9,000 students and 1,500 employees in a total of 13 schools. This public school district serves levels K-12 and has a total of 4,200 endpoints to protect.

THE CHALLENGE

For network engineer Scott Crothers, software updates were a major concern. “Before ESET, we used four or five different security products with varying success. One of our biggest challenges was keeping the AV software up to date and functioning correctly without having to touch all the machines constantly.”

THE SOLUTION

Using one of the district’s junior highs as a pilot, Crothers reimaged two labs and all the PCs in the media center. He’d let it run for a few weeks and have end users (both staff and students) submit any issues they had.

“I also would schedule full system scans in the middle of the day—when I knew there would be a full classroom in the labs—to see what performance hits would happen and if end users would notice.”

ESET’s ease, accuracy and light footprint made it the logical choice, and Crothers said the switch was seamless. “Working with the ESET implementation specialist, we were able to deploy a package that not only removed the old product but also installed ESET in an orderly fashion from a central management point—not using sneakernet!”
